- Improve retention by proactively nudging students before they fall through the cracks
- Raise completions by providing data to advisors and others







How quickly is a course filling compared to past years?




How quickly is a course filling?



Proactively nudging students


Students enrolled last term NOT enrolled this coming term

- Live Excel identifying students with Anticipated Complete status
- Advisors do targeted outreach to identified caseload to apply to graduate
- Requires EVAL process
