Adult learners may...

- Be at least 24 years of age
- Care for dependents
- Be married
- Work full-time
- Be veteran or active duty
- Qualify as independent for FAFSA purposes

- Be first-generation to attend postsecondary education
- Be diverse in race, gender, ability, socioeconomic status
- Have college credit (and debt) from multiple institutions
- Have prior justice involvement

Program is *affordable*; options for funding. Program & institution connect them to careers.

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Adult Learners and Student Debt: Alumni Insights

- Adult learners with student debt
- Clarity in educational pathway \rightarrow more likely to feel confident about future financial well-being
- Robust academic and financial aid advising improves adult learner outcomes.





Summary Findings from CAEL Adult Learner Study

- Adult learners need specialized, adult learner-focused Success
 Coaches who can provide support for their unique educational and career needs.
- Adult learners should know about **Credit for Prior Learning (CPL)** and the programs of study that currently offer CPL.
- Adult learners need more guidance with **financial aid** and more information on **scholarship opportunities**.
