




Hours Earned by Dual Credit Students in 2022-2023*Students earning 15 hours in a prior term excluded










Race/Ethnicity



Career Hours Earned








Spring 2023-24 Dual Credit Students


Transfer Status of Students Enrolled in 21-22 *Dual Credit students excluded







Adult Learner Traditional Student









Kilgore College Completions Summary









Distribution of Completions by Degree


